Moving from the experience of teaching towards political emancipation, the meeting is aimed at sharing reflections on critical pedagogies and on the ways some seminal authors have implemented their teaching practices in this perspective. How is it possible to include socially differentiated forms of appropriation of critical pedagogies in front of very diverse students?

This lecture will explore how heritage and tourism dynamics relate to political geographies of the city, drawing on case studies concerning feminist and decolonial issues in diverse European urban spaces.

Critical thinking in urban geography: exploring the city through gender and race Workshop + lesson open to the students of the Master's Degrees in **Local Development**, **Mobility Studies**, and **Techniques**, **Patrimoine**, **Territoires de I'Industrie** and anyone interested in the topic.

The seminar will start with a workshop based on a critical implementation of a community education tool called 'the privilege walk'. Drawing on the alternative readings of inhabiting the city allowed by the workshop, the works of feminist and decolonial geographers will be explored in order to critically understand urban dynamics and political issues in urban planning, and spatial justice.
